#### VIII. General - Dr. Barnes

- a. District news.
  - i. 12 students placed in the western art show for Rodeo. District chooses winners. Their artwork is displayed. Hoping to get the art back digitally to be put in the Bulldog Blast.
  - ii. Apr. 15th, Pre-k registration at Wilkinson Elementary. District-wide.
  - Looking for teachers for CISD. Registration opens Mar. 8th. Job fair is Apr. 1st. Hines Elementary is opening in August, down Lexington, across 99. Teacher movement will likely take place from all surrounding schools.

- Intermediate School boundaries revised 23-24. Legends Run and Legends Trace will be affected, but neither of those communities feed into BWE.
- v. Bond committee work begins in February. Looking at more schools. Idea hopes to be done by May. In August, the board can call for November bond election. For example, GOHS was \$150M, today it would be \$260M (inflation). Jan. 17th is the next board meeting. Will approve attendance zones for Hines and instructional calendar for 23-24.
- b. Campus news. Current enrollment is 1000 on the nose.
  - i. 29 early development, 23 Pre-k, 176 kindergarten, 182 1st, 189 2nd, 197 3rd, 204 4th. New 4th grade teacher.
  - ii. Pre-k aide and RTI aide open. Para professional positions are not compensationally competitive to other careers, so we see turnover.
  - iii. New hires. Ms. Whitfield computer aid in library. Ms. Dunn pre-k aide (furlow/ chiu). Biddle 4th grade. PE aid Ms. Owens.
  - iv. Will be a polling site May 6th.
  - v. Spring field trips being finalized. Trying to find places in cost range.
  - vi. GT testing Jan. 31-Feb. 3 for 2nd graders.
  - vii. MLK holiday Jan. 16.
  - viii. 100th day of school Jan. 26th. Kinder will have 100 day parade at 8:30 a.m.
  - ix. Field day, Apr. 5-6. PE teachers are breaking it apart so the kids have more time on the field, and 4th grade activities will be more age appropriate versus Pre-k, etc.
